Getting to Know Kathy Smith, Our New Director of Religious Education

After a long and thorough search process, the Board of Trustees hired Ms. Kathy Smith to be the new, full-time Director of Religious Education (DRE) for Community UU Church. Kathy will begin her duties officially on June 1st, but she is already attending meetings and getting to know us better. Please read her introduction below to start getting to know her too.

Hello, Community UU Church! I've been asked to write a short bio to introduce myself to you. This is always such a daunting task, even for someone who's a proven extrovert! I find myself musing over what to put in, what to leave out. While I'm sure that some people might be interested to learn that I'm a proud servant to two demanding cats, the lifelong owner of a well-loved baby grand piano, the mother of three grown children, and a lover of books old and new ... are those tidbits the sort of thing everyone really wants to know?

More relevant, perhaps, are the details about how I see myself theologically, spiritually, in the context of a religious community. When asked, I generally say, "theologically, I'm a proud Unitarian Universalist – no hyphens here." In the twenty years I have been a UU, I have become more committed to this faith with each passing year. I believe I have found my passion in working with young people in religious community, to encourage and inspire them to their best and highest selves, to nurture and sustain a community of all ages where ministry and faith development infuse everything we do. We have a faith that is life-changing and life-renewing, and we need to share it with our children and youth.

As a lay leader in various communities, I have taught Coming of Age classes, been a youth advisor and a worship associate, led children's choirs, trained teachers and advisors, and staffed camps and conferences. Professionally, I have worked as the

On **May 11** we will discuss **The Sea of Cortez by John Steinbeck**. The Sea of Cortez was published in the fall of 1941 and promptly forgotten when Pearl Harbor was struck. A decade later Steinbeck added another section, a moving and often hilarious appreciation of his friend Ed Ricketts. This group meets the second Tuesday of each month and welcomes women members and friends of Community UU Church. The **June selection is Louise Erdrich's The Plague of Doves** which is a set of stories centered around the town of Pluto, North Dakota and its neighboring Ojibwa reservation and covering the span of just over a century. In 1911, a family is murdered in Pluto with the only survivor being an infant, and a group of Indians is falsely accused of the crime and lynched. Over the generations, marriages between the whites and Indians intertwine the lives of the two communities. Evelina Harp is descended from both one of the Indians who were lynched and one of the white men who did the lynching. She goes in search of stories in an attempt to understand the murder whose ramifications still rumble through the lives of the people in Pluto.

Pamela's Page**Pamela Wat**

When I was a chaplain resident in Delaware, one of the other chaplain residents, a Reformed Jewish Rabbi-in-training, had a ring with the Hebrew words, "רובעי הז מג" (Gam Zeh Yaavor) engraved on it. We asked him what it meant. As Jewish Rabbi's often seem to do when faced with a question, he told us a story. It went something like this:

One day King Solomon asked his minister to bring him a magic ring. Its power is that if someone is happy and they look at it, it will make them sad. If someone is sad and they look at it, it will make them happy. Solomon did not believe such a ring existed, but he wanted to humble the minister. After many months of searching the minister finally found the ring which had those Hebrew words (רובעי הז מג) engraved on it. He brought it back to King Solomon. The King was in good spirits, proud of his cleverness in tricking the minister, when the minister presented him with the ring. The King read the engraving which translates as "this too shall pass." He suddenly became sad realizing that his power and riches would one day be nothing.

As I enter this time of intense transition in my life, these words keep coming to me. "This too shall pass" And sometimes it makes me shift from sad to happy; and sometimes it makes me shift from happy to sad. When I am juggling the tasks of the internship, job searching and wedding planning, I often think, "this too shall pass." I will soon enough be married and settled in a job. Sometimes as I am getting used to having a step-daughter, and my stepdaughter is getting used to having a stepmother, I think "this too shall pass." One day the awkwardness of our new family dynamics will be behind us and it will be hard to remember life before we were a family. Other times in my day, when I am enjoying the many fun projects I have as your intern, I remember these words, "this too shall pass." I suddenly remember that we have less than two months more together and soon I will be finished with all these fun projects. When I am engaged in conversations with each of you, or listening to the beautiful music in church, or when I received your generous collection on Easter Sunday to support my internship, and when I am soaking in all the many ways you minister to me, I remember "this too shall pass." I feel a wave of sadness come over me as I think about how our time together is coming to a close.

Transitions are this strange mix of anticipation and loss. Coming and going. Through these transitions I have been finding comfort in the stable cycles of nature. I watch butterflies flitting about the yard who don't seem the least bit concerned that "this too shall pass" and I don't imagine that even in their cocoons they are biding their time until they can stretch their wings in the spring air. My prayer for each of us is that we can be present in each moment, ever aware of how precious our lives are.

CONNECTING TO COMMUNITY WITH COMMITMENT

These have been a busy few months for the Stewardship Committee. We have conducted our Annual Budget Drive and, as we go to press, we have raised \$198,356 towards our annual budget to date with 105 pledges reported. Thank you to everyone who has already made a financial commitment. We now face a big challenge. Our proposed budget requires a pledged offering of \$230,000 to meet expenses this coming fiscal year. That leaves us with over a \$30,000 shortfall. In the coming weeks as we work to close the gap, we will need your support.

As visiting stewards, it has been a privilege for us to meet with so many of you to hear about the importance of this community in your lives. We also heard stories of financial struggle that these tough economic times have created for many of you. We recognize that unemployment or underemployment, retirement and other situations have made it difficult for some to pledge as they have in previous years. As we enter the final stretch of our Annual Budget Drive, we ask those who are in a position to financially support our community to do so. It takes a community to support a community.

Members of the Stewardship Team will be in the foyer and the entrance to Fellowship Hall after Sunday services in May to distribute and accept commitment forms. If you have not pledged, now is the time to connect to community with your commitment. If you have already made a commitment, please consider whether you can dig a little deeper to help close the budget gap. As they say, give till it feels good. You can't go wrong.

Social Action

Beginning in May, Community UU will begin a series of programs on “Ethical Eating”. This is a Congregational Study/Action Issue that the UUA began in 2008, but our church has not participated in the study until now. Unitarian Universalists have a vision of environmental justice and we respect "the interdependent web of all existence". These beliefs drive us to examine issues of food production and distribution, hunger, and the effect of our food choices on the environment.

The UUA suggests the following components for the program:

- Ethical Eating
- Human Rights
- Animal Welfare

Environmental Stewardship

The Social Action Committee (formerly called Faith in Action) has planned several events that will occur over the next few months, beginning with the Sunday service on May 30, where our ministerial intern Pamela Wat will provide an introduction to the series. The following events will follow:

- June: a showing of the film “Fresh”, which emphasizes healthier, sustainable alternatives to our current food system
- July: visits to local farms
- August: a service presented by members who will share perspectives on eating as well as a report on our own community garden
