What Did We do in RE This Week? The theme for this month is **Salvation** and this week we participated in the #UUWhiteSupremacyTeachin, looking at how we build beloved community in a society that struggles with systemic oppression. **PreK:** I Have Skin! *Ask your child:* How many colors does people skin come in? What are some of the things that skin is good for? **K-7th Grade:** Children's Chapel (What You See Depends on Where You Stand). *Ask your child, depending on age:* What are some of the ways your family is similar to your friends' families? How is it different? Are any of those differences because of race, culture, or religion? Why is it as important to celebrate our differences as to look for our similarities? **High School:** Worship. *Ask your teen:* When you hear or read the words "White Supremacy," what thoughts come to mind, what emotions surface? Why do you think we used those words in church today? Rev. Sofia Betancourt, interim co-president for our Unitarian Universalist Association, says, "We are not saying there is an inherent evil in Unitarian Universalism, at all. We are saying there is a desperate need for the kind of beloved community work that we offer in the world and we want to do that work better." What do you think about Rev. Betancourt's words?
